A Child Shall Lead

This is Stella Grace Yochum on the day following her first birthday and on the day of her baptism.

During his baptismal vow, Pastor Bill placed his hand on Stella's head, called her by name and said, "Child of the Covenant." He alluded to the fact that even before her birth, God knew and claimed her. She belongs to God and her baptism seals her identity as a child of God.

Sunday is the 2nd Sunday of Advent in which we will read from Isaiah 11, "The wolf shall live with the lamb, the leopard shall lie down with the kid, the calf and the lion and the fatling together, and a little child shall lead them. The cow and the bear shall graze, their young shall lie down together; and the lion shall eat straw like the ox. The nursing child shall play over the hole of the asp, and the weaned child shall put its hand on the adder's den. They will not hurt or destroy on all my holy mountain; for the earth will be full of the knowledge of the Lord as the waters cover the sea."

Obviously, Isaiah foretells a time yet to come. Seriously, can you imagine the wolf living with a lamb, the kid and the leopard moving in together and the cow and the bear sharing a meal not consisting of beef! In the midst of these amazing promises is yet another, "and a little child shall lead them." Among this unusual scenario, almost as an afterthought that a child will lead them.

Theologians know that the child who will lead speaks of Christ who would come as a baby to lead the world not by force of power but by love. Advent continues our wait for the assurance that Christ indeed will lead us beyond our comfort zones, and beyond the norms that define how we relate to one another.

And I cannot help but think of Stella following her baptism, prayerfully, that even as a child she will lead us all, beginning with the Yochum's and the Coggins to a deeper walk with Christ.


What Are We Waiting For?
