Congregations throughout North America are living in times of shrinking budgets, aging facilities and sagging ranks of volunteers. Less people are trying desperately to perform the same functions for the church that we have faithfully performed for years.

But there is help and hope on the horizon. Jesus set the scene for us by seeing the best in everyone and feeding the five thousand with a minimal amount. He even had plenty left following the meal.

Sunday 30 persons from St. Andrew's are registered for an exercise called Asset Mapping. It starts with our interests (listing the resources within our congregation that we may have overlooked as resources) and moves us into action by forming clusters of ideas of how we might become involved in using our resources differently.

These 30 persons will move from the worship service into the Lecture Room for a catered meal followed by our participation in the Asset Mapping exercise.

As Isaiah 43 reminds us, "See I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up: do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the desert and streams in the wasteland."




