Nomination of secretary: Session is grateful that Jerry Verwey has agreed to assume the important role of Session Clerk, effective the February 21. Recognizing that Jerry Verwey has responsibility for the AV system to include those online in the Annual Meeting, Colina Titus offered to take minutes of the meeting.

MOTION 1: It was moved and seconded that Colina Titus be nominated as Secretary for the meeting.

Explanation of process for Annual meeting and subsequent voting: An outline of process was circulated.

MOTION 2: It was moved and seconded that the process for participation and voting be approved as presented.

Review and approval of the minutes of '2021 Annual Meeting and 2022 Budget Meeting'

MOTION 3: It was moved and seconded that the minutes of the '2021 Annual Meeting and 2022 Budget Meeting', be accepted as presented in the Annual Report 2022.

Review and approval of minutes from Congregational Meeting July 10, 2022: to a) confirm the names of the Trustees and b) approve the Declaration of Trust document. This was required due to a change to the Land Transfer Act.

MOTION 4: It was moved and seconded that the minutes of the 'July 10, 2022 Congregational Meeting' be accepted as presented in the Annual Report 2022.

Review and approval of committee reports as presented in the Annual Report: emailed, mailed and posted on the website. Includes reports from 30 church group/activities.

MOTION 5: It was moved and seconded that the reports presented in the Annual Report be approved.

MOTION 6: The congregation of St Andrew's Presbyterian Church, Victoria affirms the appointment of the following persons as Trustees for the congregation:

Arthur Marcellus, David McLean, Dirk Ryneveld, Jack Reimer and Moira Bernard

Upgrade and refurbishment of the Lecture room for St

Andrew's use: A proposed upgrade of the lecture room to become a multi-purpose meeting room: coffee time, meetings etc. Recommendation presented that the congregation agrees to spend \$20,000 from the following funds.

- \$8,500 from the Kirk Hall accessibility fund
- \$10,000 from the Marion Patterson fund
- \$1,500 from the earnings from the Spring Market and Tea.

This is to reclaim the Lecture room for St Andrew's use; Ballet Victoria no longer rents this space.


The Marion Patterson Fund is a legacy designated for 'physical improvement of the facilities'.


