Parable of the Pastor

Sunday, April 9 is not a normal Sunday. Certainly, we will gather for worship at 10:30 AM. The choir, reader and minister will process from the Lecture Room. The Lenten cross will be lit for the last time, and the hymns sung by choir and congregation. We will celebrate communion, receive the offering, and participate in the Prayers of the People. The worship on Sunday, April 9 may seem remarkably similar to the worship of every worship throughout the year, but in no way should Sunday be confused with other Sundays.

Easter Sunday is the most significant worship service on the Christian calendar! We must gather to worship not as the same people we were the week before. We come to celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ and for this reason alone, our spirits are lifted above mere worship which can often seem routine and rather ordinary. We and the choir sing...

Jesus Christ is ris'n today, Alleluia! our triumphant holy day, Alleluia! who did once upon the cross, Alleluia! suffer to redeem our loss. Alleluia!

But first, experiencing the miracle of Easter is not automatic. You may be lulled into entering St. Andrew's, being handed an order of worship, picking up a hymnal and beginning the regular habit of normal worship. How might you prepare yourself to celebrate Easter Sunday as the most significant worship service on the Christian calendar? There are several avenues for preparing your heart and mind for Easter.

Hopefully you have engaged in the Lenten opportunities of using the Lenten Reader and of attending one of the Lenten studies we have offered over these last several weeks. The Ash Wednesday service that began the 40-day Lenten journey to Easter was for several an opportunity to commit these weeks to self-examination, study and to prayer.

St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church acknowledges and thanks the Lekwungen People – WSÁNEĆ, Songhees and Esquimalt First Nations – on whose traditional land we meet and worship.

There remain two other possibilities to prepare your heart and mind for Easter. Maundy Thursday on April 6 at 3:00 PM at Knox Presbyterian Church will be a service of lessons and hymns trekking the journey of Jesus into Jerusalem for the last time and Good Friday on April 7 at 10:30 at Trinity Presbyterian Church remain the two most significant preparatory possibilities remaining left that will help prepare us for Easter. Please consider attending one of both.

Finally, come on Sunday, April 9 prepared not for our normal service of worship or else you may miss the most significant celebration at St. Andrew's since Sunday, April 17, 2022 when Easter was celebrated last year. Come and worship, worship Christ who is not here, He is risen. He is risen indeed.



Te'mexw Nations have been in

 negotiation since 1995 and are now in Stage 5, the second last stage before implementation

EACH TREATY WILL:

- Address important matters of language, culture, and heritage
 - Recognize the pre-existing rights of each Nation & establish self-government and law-making power

WHAT'S HAPPENING?

- 2 provincial crown lands being used as parking lots are under consideration
