# Parable of the Pastor

#### Friend, You Speak to My Condition

Over the last two weeks, I have been in touch with families that are planning Celebrations of Life for loved ones in the coming days. Families are saying their "good byes", closing out living arrangements and looking toward the type funeral that best celebrates the life of their beloved. These are stressful and heartbreaking times that will hopefully become opportunities to remember the person who brought such love and joy to so many. It is during these times that we remember the incredible gift of each person and take the time to share that with someone.

In the Quaker community, there are particular ideas and phrases that have always made me think. A Quaker phrase that I've always appreciated is "Friend, you speak to my condition." This phrase is used whenever someone says something that goes right to your heart, or when the words spoken were what you most needed to hear.

When someone speaks straight to your heart, what a gift it is to let that person know, "Friend, you speak to my condition" or some modern variation of that sentiment. It is a way to say thank you when someone risked following their heart and the impulse of love.

Carrie Newcomer is a favourite Quaker artist of mine from Indiana. She writes, "In these troubling times often is it best to listen, wonder and really hear the story of another, even someone who's opinions and view of the world is very different than my own. So I guess the encouragement today is to trust when your heart calls you to speak, take the risk to reach out, have the grace and courage to speak the words that must be said, to risk making a mistake for loves sake. Also, take time to allow silence to enter into your sound filled life, to listen before speaking during a pause in the conversation, and perhaps to listen when you heart needs a little calm and quiet...and seek it out. After a moment in the quiet, hum a favorite calming melody. Feel the way the melody lifts or opens your heart. Feel the pleasantness of moving your vocal chords. Enjoy the balance of silence and sound.

**On a personal note...** following the funeral on Sunday at 2:00 PM for Nancy Sidaway in the sanctuary, Linda and I will leave Monday for our first trip to Montreal. I will be teaching at the Encouragement Conference sponsored by Presbyterian College for leaders of congregations. It will be exciting to lead learning conversations with a group of 40 or more in recognizing the vast differences in the maps that congregations are now shifting to in rethinking and repurposing our mission and ministry. This group will learn and practice the asset mapping exercise in their own congregations that we discovered at St. Andrew's a short time ago.

Linda and I will remain in Montreal following the conference to explore and experience this beautiful and remarkable city. I pray for each of you days in which you will say to someone with deep sentiment, "Friend, you speak to my condition."
