PARABLE OF THE PASTOR

Sunday, September 3 (Long weekend!), I am considering a sermon called "God in the Margins." Our teacher for the day is none other than Moses whose story we begin when he was hiding out from the Law. He was tending his father-in-law's sheep in a remote place when God spoke to him in from an unusual place.

We received an email this week from someone looking to connect with a Presbyterian minister to preform hers and her fiancé's upcoming wedding. I replied that I would be willing to speak to her at her convenience and offered times when that might be possible, even days weeks ahead. She replied almost immediately indicating that the wedding would be best if it occurred before 1:00 PM...the same day...and it was already 10:30 AM! I asked her to call my number on the email but did not hear from her again. I wonder how God may have been speaking to me (to us) through the desperation of those who may be living within strict timelines and life has been reduced to deadlines?

I met someone Sunday at Worship in the Park that was a member of another congregation. She asked me about my upcoming surgery and told me that she would be praying for me. I don't recall having met her previously, but she knew what I was facing. She asked the date for my procedure, and I believed her when she indicated that she would pray for me on this day and following. I wonder how God nudges us through our interactions with those we do not know well and reminds us that indeed God sees and knows us like God knows the hairs on our head.

Last week I received an email from a colleague in Minnesota prayerful for those affected by the wildfires in British Columbia. She provided a video of a Mennonite choir singing:

We are not alone. We are not alone. We are not alone. God is with us. We are not alone. We are not alone. We are not alone. God is with us.

They sang the song in rounds and by the end, I was convinced. We are not alone; God is with us. I wonder if through the prayers offered during the incredible devastation of wildfires throughout North America, somehow in some way, do we believe that we are never alone, and that God is indeed with us.

It took a burning bush and for God to tell Moses who was speaking but perhaps by the end of the conversation, Moses was convinced. God is in our margins as well. Does not God speak to us through strangers perhaps asking and telling us amazing truths? Do we dare trust that for ourselves? Where have you seen God in the margins of your life! Peace and blessings to all.
