PARABLE OF THE PASTOR

What is Advent and why is it significant? The word advent is not used in the Bible. It means "wait" and refers to the world waiting for something remarkable to happen. The Hebrew people waited for generations for the Messiah.

Each Advent we again wait expectantly for the birth of the Christ child. But Christ was born long ago, to parents who had no place to deliver him other than a borrowed stable. Again, this year, however, we are reminded of the significance of waiting and the powerful effects upon our lives of Advent waiting. For what or for whom do we wait?

Hope, Peace, Joy, Love? Yes, to all! Our dark and lonely world groans for good news. War spills from the lips of dictators to the munitions of armies to the innocent lives caught in the crossfire. Who will win? The strongest? The loudest? The dictator and the army with the most ammunition?

Benjamin Howard relates a story in *The Wondrous Mystery: An Upper Room Advent Reader* of an Iroquois tale about how the animals in the forest held a council to decide if they should have light in the midst of an all-dark world. The story contained two main characters with opposing opinions. Bear adamantly growled, "We must have darkness." This put an end to most discussion since Bear, by virtue of its size and gruffness, carried a lot of weight in the council of animals. But young Chipmunk, undaunted by Bear's power, bravely sang out, "Let there be light," again and again until the sun actually spread its gleam throughout the forest world.

Our Advent wait is for the light to reach us again. We need to be reminded that hope, peace, joy and love are still possible. Christ is coming again but we must be prepared. We must not be too busy to recognize His light because we are occupied with other more immediate and pressing duties.

Wait patiently but wait purposefully. Wait knowing that that Christ is coming to our dark world. Light is on the way. Thanks be to God!

May your Advent wait fill you with God's perfect peace,




