PARABLE OF THE PASTOR

FREE \$100 BILL, FREE \$100 BILL, FREE \$100 BILL ... I hope that gets your attention, but likely not. I have head of late that fewer and fewer take time to read TWASA and even the Link. Mention an upcoming event that has been in TWASA or the Sunday bulletin and it is not unusual to be met with a perplexed response, "I did not know or hear about that." "But it was in last week's newsletter!" I don't read that! What if I gave away free \$100 bills? How many would indicate reading that news in TWASA!!!! I am not giving away \$100 bills but every week several persons spend considerable time compiling the news worthy and upcoming events that will be formative for St. Andrew's to know in the coming days ... to be informed...to stay involved...to be inspired and challenged! How distressing to hear, "I don't read that!"

But then, Mitch missed something a while back that is worth noting. Last August, this article appeared in the Times Columnist...

Artist Tanya Bub (Victoria Driftwood sculptor) wanted to build a bridge of empathy between the street community and the rest of the city. So she created Sitting with Grace, a colourful human figure made from paper, wire and up-cycled garbage that is also a kind of throne. "I am using art as a way of opening doors and breaking down barriers — as a way of connecting," said Bub. "We are all poorer without discovering the warmth and generosity that exists in the [street] community." Bub took the sculpture to various locations in Victoria where people in the un-housed community congregate, and used the sculpture as an ice breaker and conversation starter, encouraging people to sit on the throne and to ask questions at each stop. She made them part of the piece, inviting them to contribute by leaving a message or drawing.



The powerful unscripted 1-hour documentary has impacted not only the un-housed community but the greater Victoria community as well! The Sitting with Grace sculpture was on display last Fall at the Gage Gallery in August and September. (I must have not been paying attention so I missed it.).

But another opportunity exists to Sit with Grace and hear the story of this amazing gift of empathy and connection. This weekend I heard that the statue, and Tanya and Ross and several from the documentary will be present on Sunday, Jan 21, 6:00 PM–7:30 PM at the Cedar Hill Recreation Centre 3220 Cedar Hill Road Victoria, BC V8P 3Y3. I secured our free tickets. This is an amazing story worth more than FREE 100\$ bills. It reminds me to pay attention and even when I do not, chances are there will be another opportunity to "sit with grace" and drink deeply of the lessons that grace has to teach us. May it be so for you as well.

Frederick Buechner writes that "my story and your story are all part of each other too if only because we have sung together and prayed together and seen each other's faces...all our stories are in the end one story, one vast story about being human, being together, being here."

So, each of our stories do matter. When we share from our experience, we strengthen the body of Christ. We aren't asking for your perfection, we are asking you to take a risk and share a bit of your unique life as a person of faith.

CURIOUS ABOUT JOY

Those who go out weeping, bearing the seed for sowing, shall come home with shouts of joy, carrying their sheaves. - Psalm 126:6

By now most of us are familiar with Jan Richardson, one of Reverend Coggin's favourite devotional authors. Each year she offers a Women's Christmas Retreat rooted in the Irish custom of celebrating Epiphany as Women's Christmas; women took Epiphany as an occasion to celebrate together at the end of the holidays.

Women's Christmas offers an opportunity to pause and step back from whatever has kept us busy and hurried in the past weeks or months. As the Christmas season ends, this is an occasion both to celebrate with friends and to spend time in reflection before diving into what this new year will hold. This year's retreat is entitled, Curious About Joy.

Jan asks, "In a time when the anguish of the world can flatten it right out of us, how might we become intent on joy instead of giving up on it? How might it be to approach joy as a practice - one that does not hinge on ignorance of circumstances but staying present in the midst of them?"

Through this retreat she invites us to contemplate how joy shows up for us or might want to find its way into our life.
